

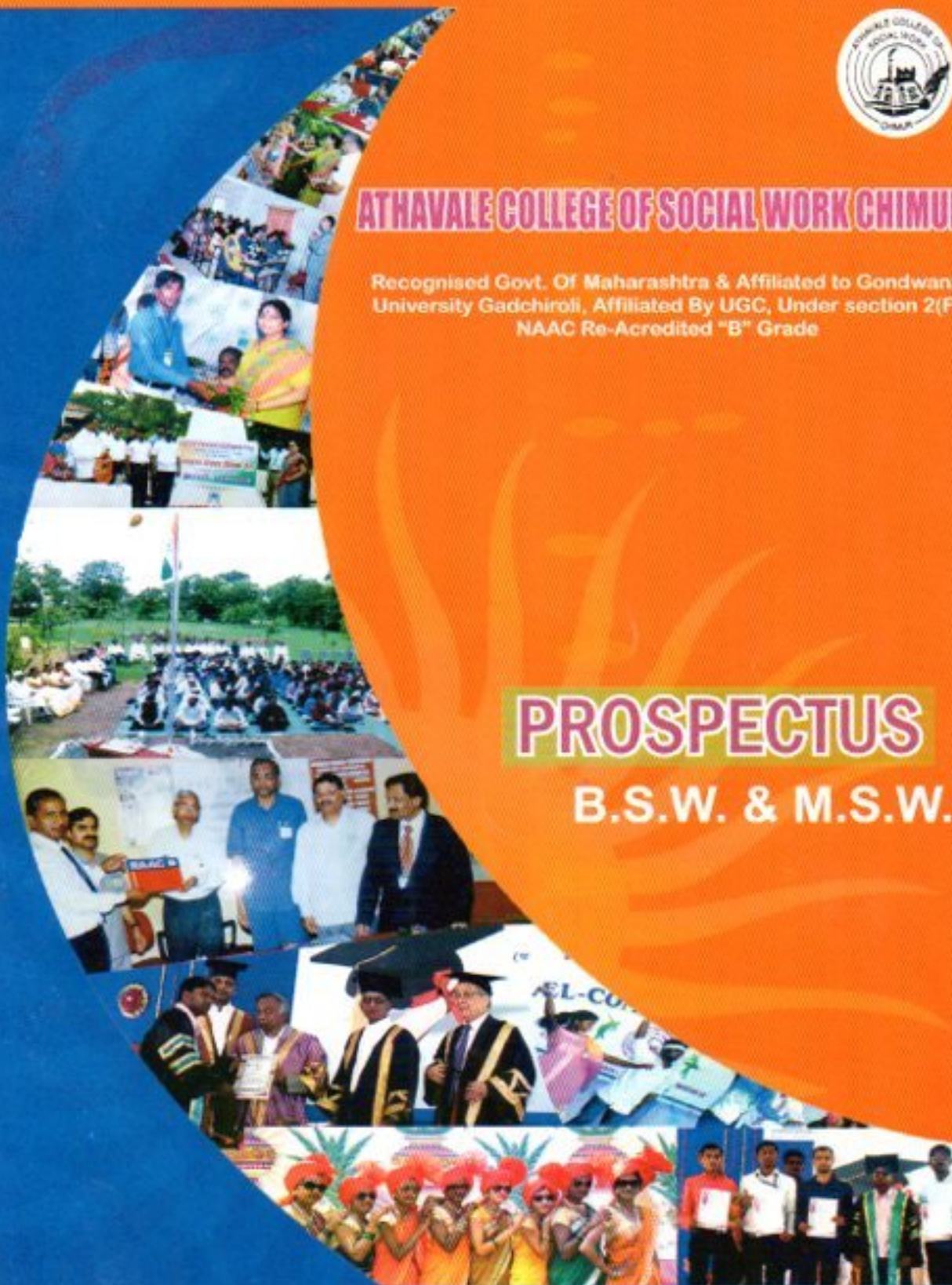

- ❖ All parents/guardians of admitted students become members of the Parents Association of the college. Those who apply for transfer certificate have to pay the full annual fee.

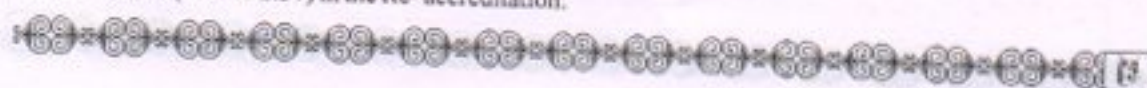
### ABOUT THE COLLEGE

## 2.5 Rules and Regulations for the students

### **3. GENERAL INFORMATION :**

#### **3.1 Admission Procedure :**

Application for admission to any programme of study must be on the prescribed application form which along with prospectus is supplied by the college. A non-refundable registration fee of Rs. 30/- for B.S.W., Rs. 60/- for M.S.W. is payable at the time of submission of application form.

Attested true copies of the following certificate must be attached with the application form and originals must be produced at the time of the interview.

1. Certificate of 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> examination.
2. Transfer / Leaving certificate from the last institution attended.
3. Adhar card Xerox.
4. Migration certificate (only for other university student)
5. Eligibility certificate (for students for other university)
6. Caste certificate & Validity certificate (if applicable)
7. Non-cremylayer certificate (if applicable)
8. Recent passport size photograph (two copies)
9. Domicile certificate (if applicable)
10. Bank Passbook Xerox

#### **3.2 The Selection**

After scrutiny of the application the candidates will be called for written examination, personal interview, individual performance etc. by selection committee. List of selected candidates will be displayed on the notice board of the institute. The selected candidates must pay the required fee within the specified period.

The decision of the admission committee and principal regarding admission to all programmes shall be final.

#### **3.3 Reporting date**

The selected candidates shall be informed about the date of reporting and the formalities to be completed within the specified time. The candidates should comply with the same failing which their claim for admission shall stand cancelled. The students are expected to attend the classes from the date notified.

#### **3.4 Attendance**

B.S.W. & M.S.W. are full-time programmes of study. A minimum of 80% attendance in theory classes is compulsory. Students should have the stipulated attendance in social work practicum wherever prescribed. Those who do not fulfill the above mentioned requirements may not be eligible to appear in the university examination.



#### 4. B.S.W. PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

**Introduction:** The Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) programme shall be of three years (Six Semester) duration. The programme shall spread over six semesters. The degree of Bachelor of Social Work is equivalent to professional bachelor degree in social work. The BSW programme is aim to equip students to work as a change agent at grass root level and contribute up to policy level. It is a recognised qualification for professional positions, in Governmental, industrial and voluntary sector organizations. This degree equips a student with knowledge, skills and attitude required to field of social work.

**Eligibility:** A Student passed with higher secondary examination (10+2 pattern), or Certificate course in social work or any other equivalent certificate course.

**Medium of Instruction:** Medium of instruction shall be Marathi, Hindi or English

**Course Structure:** The following shall be the theory classes, Field Work practicum and Group Research Project in the semester pattern for the Bachelor of Social Work to be introduce from the academic session 2017-2018.

### 5. Information on Master of Social Work (M.S.W.) Course:

This course is base on credit based semester pattern and therefore, it shall be regulated by guidelines and regulation issued by the Gondwana University Gadchiroli from time to time.

#### Admission & Eligibility to the course:

- Subject to the compliance with the provisions of the university direction and of other ordinances in force from time to time an applicant for admission to semester-I examination shall have passed any Bachelor Degree examination of this university or of any other discipline (any graduate) as equivalent to the Bachelor Degree of this university. Preference shall be given to B.S.W. degree passed candidate.
- The applicant who have passed semester-I shall be eligible for admission to semester-II subject to ATKT rules.
- The applicant who have passed semester-II shall be eligible for admission semester-III subject to ATKT rules. Candidate should have passed at least 50% subject of every semester.
- The applicant who have passed semester-III shall be eligible for admission of semester-IV subject to ATKT rules. Candidates should have passed at list 50% subject of semester-I, II and III taken together.



### **Duration of the Course :**

Duration of the M.S.W. course shall be of Two academic year consisting of semester I and II in first year and semester III and IV in second year.

### **Social Work Practicum:**

In addition to the theory paper, there shall be social work practicum during each of the four semesters. The contents of social work practicum shall vary from semester to semester as indicated in the program structure. Concurrent social work practicum shall be conducted at a social work agency / organization / community / hospital / factory recognized for such purposes by the training institution. Concurrent social work practicum shall be conducted during two days a week for 6 credit (15 clock Hrs. per week 12 week) during each semester. Each student shall be supervised in their concurrent social work practicum by a social work teacher from the agency and an approved social work teacher from the affiliated college.

### **Research Dissertation Based on Specialization:**

In addition to theory papers and social work practicum, each student shall be required to undertake independent research work and prepare a dissertation based on primary data during 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> semester. The topic of such research dissertation shall be relevant to the specialization group opted by the student. The topic of research dissertation shall be finalized only after the university approves the same. Each student shall be supervised in their research dissertation by an approved faculty member from the college.

### **Rural / Tribal Camps:**

Rural / Tribal camps provide opportunities to students to experience rural life. Make first hand observation about rural realities analyze rural dynamics and observe the functioning of local self-government & voluntary organization. This experience aids peer participation in planning for activities for own group and those for local people. It also help develop skill to carryout evaluate and report the experience. It also gives students prospects for engaging themselves in rural reconstruction. Rural camp of minimum 7 days should be organized during the second semester. It shall be a residential camp in a rural or tribal setting and be mandatory for each student to attend the rural / tribal camp.





### Educational Tour:

The Educational tour is aimed to provide an exposure to students to study and appreciate individual efforts by individuals and group towards intervention, meeting people's core needs and to initiate development. The education tour shall be of 6 days duration and it shall be either to an urban setting or setting or a mix of urban and rural setting, depending on the specialization of the students. During educational tour the students should visit a minimum of five developmental agencies, out of which at least one should be relevant to their specialization group. It shall be organized by the institution during the semester. Educational tour shall be mandatory for all students.

### Block Placement:

M.S.W. fourth semester students are encouraged to undertake block placement of 21 days. Block placement is one of the components of social work practicum, where in after the completion of the first field work, an opportunity is provided to the learner to strengthen his / her skill and knowledge base in a field area of interest. After the completed university exam, 21 days block placement shall be mandatory for all students. Otherwise those students result not publish by a university.

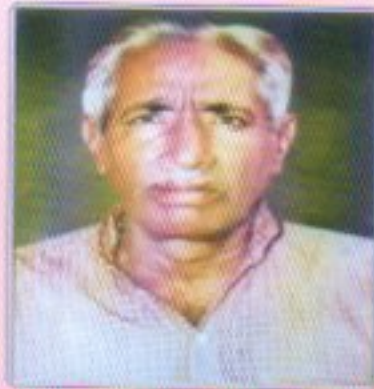
