This small plant placed in rural and remote area of Chandrapur District has now grown into a gigantic tree with its fruitful success.

The institute offers not only UG and PG level professional social work courses but also research Centre for scholar students. Recently, the centre for higher learning studies is started to avail scientific approaches among the students and faculties. Besides the curricular upliftment institute has been caring its social responsibilities. College organizes rural camp, NSS Camp and other awareness programme in adjacent village as its social responsibility towards community and nation.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Athavale College of Social Work has been running BSW, MSW, M.Phil. courses as per the directives of university the academic calendar is being followed. The time table for college framed as per the directives of university. The course syllabus is designed by board of studies of university. The teaching learning process adopted as per the academic calendar of college. Beside that add on certificate course have been run by our college there were 57 students in last 5 years. The institution carried out several initiatives to enhance the ethics, morals human values among the student with which the students have environmental awareness, sustainable development. There were 237 students in 2022-23. There are compulsory activities for the student as the college is professional social work department, the students are to perform the practical, field work, project work (research) internship etc.

We take the feedback of stakeholder students, teachers, employee, alumni, library. The analysis of feedback is done in the principal's chamber where necessary action is taken. As per the feedback from stakeholder taken into consideration for redesigning the curricula. The redesigned curricula is published an website. The process to improve the teaching learning process is updated as the newly designed curricula. This help to improve the quality of students and teachers as well.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

There were 15 teachers in academic session 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21 while 2021-22, 2022-23 there were 14 teachers. As per the 237 students the ratio to teacher is 16.93%. The teacher have3 adopted effective teaching learning process as experimental method problem solving method, participative learning. The teachers use ICT tools to enhance the better learning experience. There were 18 post approved. In 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21 the 15 fulltime teachers were appointed. There were 14 fulltime teacher in 2021-22, 2022-23. Now the fulltime teacher for English subject is appointed. Out of 14 Assistant Professor, 12 techers are Ph.D. holder while 3 teachers are NET, SET qualified. There are 6 teachers for supervision of Ph.D. Cell. The is woman grievance redressal cell that solves the grievance of woman as and when comes.

The students gains the jobs and human values, ethics, on the course completion. That is the outcome of programme/course. There were 1315 students admitted in last five year against 1600 that percentile is 82.19%.

There are 237 students for internal evaluation survey that found best college in rural area by 10% students. A list of 237 students with template have been submitted to NAAC.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The institution obtained the government fund of Rs. 2 Lac in 2018-19 and 50 Thousand in 2022-23. Which is utilize for programme. A teachers Dr. M. B. Rewatkar has filled patent. The institution organize 13 seminar, conference and workshop in last five years. The research publication of 32 papers have been submitted in UGC Care List. There are 69 paper have been publish in other than UGC Care List. The students are taken to the adjacent village for their holistic development to sensitize with community, family etc. The outrich programme conducted by college in collaboration of NSS, Gender Issue Committee to conduct programme on HIV/AIDS awareness, Gender issue, Swatcchha Bharat, Village collaboration, NGO collaboration. In 2018-19 there were Six programme, conducted while in 2019-20 Eight programme in 2020-21 Thirteen programme, in 2021-22 Twenty Five and in 2022-23 Twenty Five programme hae been conducted so for. There is 40 collaboration/linkage for faculty exchange, student exchange, internship field trip, on the job training, research and academic activities during the last five years.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The college has ICT facilities for classroom teaching like, digital board, projector, computer. The teachers use to teach the curricula on digital devices. There is gymnasium, cultural stage, kho-kho, kabaddi, valley ball ground, badminton ground. There is yoga faculty for students.

The expenditure for infrastructure augmentation excluding salary against total expenditure excluding salary having percentile is 0.199% There is well furnished library in the college premise having good number of books, research paper, journal maxim, newspapers, dissertations, study literature, software facility for students. There is 10 mbps internet facility open for students. There is wi-fi open facility for students. There are 40 computers in E-Library. The ratio of computer against the students number is 6:1. The percentage of expenditure incurred on maintenance of infrastructure is 0.97 Lac. The institution regularly undergoes audit. The audit for last five years have been done by institution.

Student Support and Progression

The students are benefitted by government in the form of scholarship and freeship. The percentage of the students benefitted by government agencies are as follows, in 2018-19 - 266, in 2019-20 - 230, and in 2021-22 - 129, and 2022-23 - 230 students get scholarship and freeship. In last five year out of 1315 students 989 the percentage of beneficiaries for scholarship and freeship is 75.2%.

There is capacity building and skill enhancement initiative organize by institution. There were 20 students per year admitted for language and communication skill. There is yoga, physical fitness, health and hygiene programme to enhance awareness among the students. There is E-Library available for soft skill development.

The students were benefitted for competitive examination. There were 54 student in 2021-22 while 2019 to 2021 because of pandemic corona no report have been displayed.

There statutory/regulatory body for redressal of students grievance including sexual harassment there is organization wide awareness and undertaking on policies with zero tolerance in the body. There is online-offline committee take necessary action for redressal of students grievances.

The students placement percentage during last five year is as follows. In 2018-19 in campus 52 and out

campus 52, In 2019-20 the placement of students in campus 45 and out campus 5, In 2022-23 the students placement is 35. The percentage of final year outgoing students is 64.68. The 1 student from our college have qualified the NET/SET examination. The college has awarded by one award by university.

There were 431 students have participated in the cultural, sport competition. Alumni organization is registered and 175 alumni member unit is formed in the college which organize the various programme in the college.

Governance, Leadership and Management

As per the vision and mission of the institution the governance of college is being conducted and the teaching-learning process strictly follows the vision and mission of college. The institution follows the rules and regulation of government policies. The appointment and governance administration set up, appointment and service rule deployment of institutional strategies. The administration follows the rules framed by government.

There is online performance of admission, finance and accounts, students admission and support, students examination on online basis. As per the govt. rule, GIC, PF, maternity leave, casual leave, compassion appointment are being provided the college.

College provided support fund to teachers for conference, workshop, seminar. In 2021-22 four teachers and 2022-23 seven teachers were financially supported by college. There were 19 teachers have done faculty development programme/refresher course/ orientation programme while non-teaching staff have done body building programme.

Institution has specific strategy for funds that received from government and other resources. The fund is audited regularity by C.A. The college maintain the regular account of every expenditure and income from various resources in which university and social welfare department would assess the audit.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell regulate the development activities, curricular activities quality enhancement etc. It conduct regular meeting, feedback collection and use for improvement.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The is co-education system in the college. The girls and boys take education together. The togetherness gives rise to gender equality among the students. College marks various programmes of national international commemorative days. College organizes blood donation camp, NSS camp, rural camp, tribal camp, constitutional day, awareness of corona, HIV/AIDS days, National literacy day etc.

There is soak pit, masic pit, compost pit for management of degradable and non degradable waste. There is rain water harvesting system for rain water management. There is water cooler, water purifier with beautiful green campus. The green audit have been done. 1.1 Curricular Planning and Implementation

The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Response:

Institute follows the directives of Gondwana University Gadchiroli. The curriculum of Interdisciplinary stream is held by concerning board of studies for both UG and PG Level. Accordingly our institute planned the curriculum delivery method. All the aspect of curriculum delivery are kept in record. As per the planning the syllabus is complied. The practical work is governed by concerning supervisor. The curriculum must be complied within given time period. Hence to verify the completed course the examination held at certain interval. In this examination unit test, test exam, are conducted by concerned faculties. They keeps the record of curriculum delivered and performance of the student in relevant subject. As for the practical work is concerned, the field supervisor check the progress of students which is recorded in their daily dairy and journal. The planning of curriculum delivery is done before the beginning of each semester which is authenticated by principal and IQAC. This planning is referred occasionally during test examination. The result analysis of test examination conducted at college level is matched with planning documents.

This planning also include the facility for the student to make them available the textbooks notes and necessary reference books. The teacher adopt the best pedagogical practice to make the student confident about particular topic. Eventually the classroom discussion and interaction between teacher and student occur. This help the students for comprehensive study. As per the key word of our institution we provide the joyful education to student for that as for as practical work is concerned we take the student to the concerning government and non-government agencies to face and experience the problem.
